- 4. What are the advantages and disadvantages of raising livestock?
- 5. What are your goals/ambitions for raising livestock in the future?
- 6. Other information you may want to share with the evaluators---pictures, awards, school activities, clubs, leadership roles, etc.
- B. You must include as part of your application one recommendation letter from someone outside your family. Ideally this would be someone who has had experience with you as a livestock producer.
